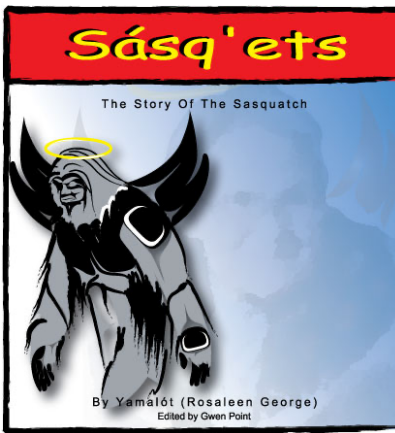


## Sásq'ets- some phrases and patterns



### Pattern 1:

Osu xéte "Xwe'ítsetcha kwa?"

He said "What will we do?"

Which part means "he"? Which part means "we"? How could you use other words to say "I, you, they, etc" ?

### Pattern 2:

Lólts'e álhtel lite lálém.

They were alone in the house.

Le<sup>1</sup> tl'ékw'el te héyeqws álhtel.

Their fire went out.

How would you say:

**I/you/she/he** was alone in the house?

How would you say:

**my/your** fire went out

remember the pattern:

te + **l** = tel my

te+ **a'** = ta' your

te+(word)s = his/hers/theirs

<sup>1</sup> 'le' is a third person (he/she/they) that indicates recent past. **le álhtel (cheláqelh)** he/she/they ate (yesterday)

**Pattern 3:**

**sí:simet – to be afraid of something, he/she is afraid of it**

How would you say:	I am afraid of it
	I am afraid of you
	we are afraid of it

remember the pattern for object endings (translated above as (of) it/you/him)

-óx	me
-óme	you
- —	him/her/it/them
- óxw/ólxw	us
- óle	you folks

How would you translate this?	<b>máytóxwes</b>
	<b>kw'etslóxwes</b>
	<b>th'exwmetóxwes</b>
	<b>xólhmetóxw</b>
